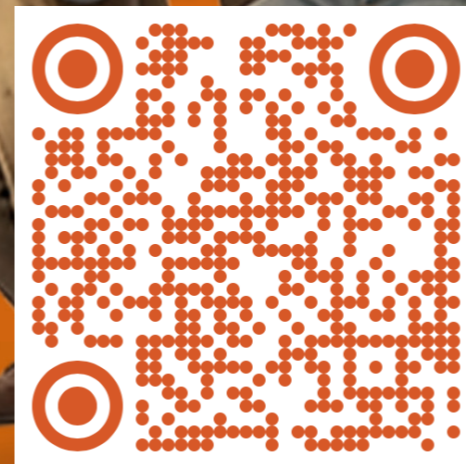

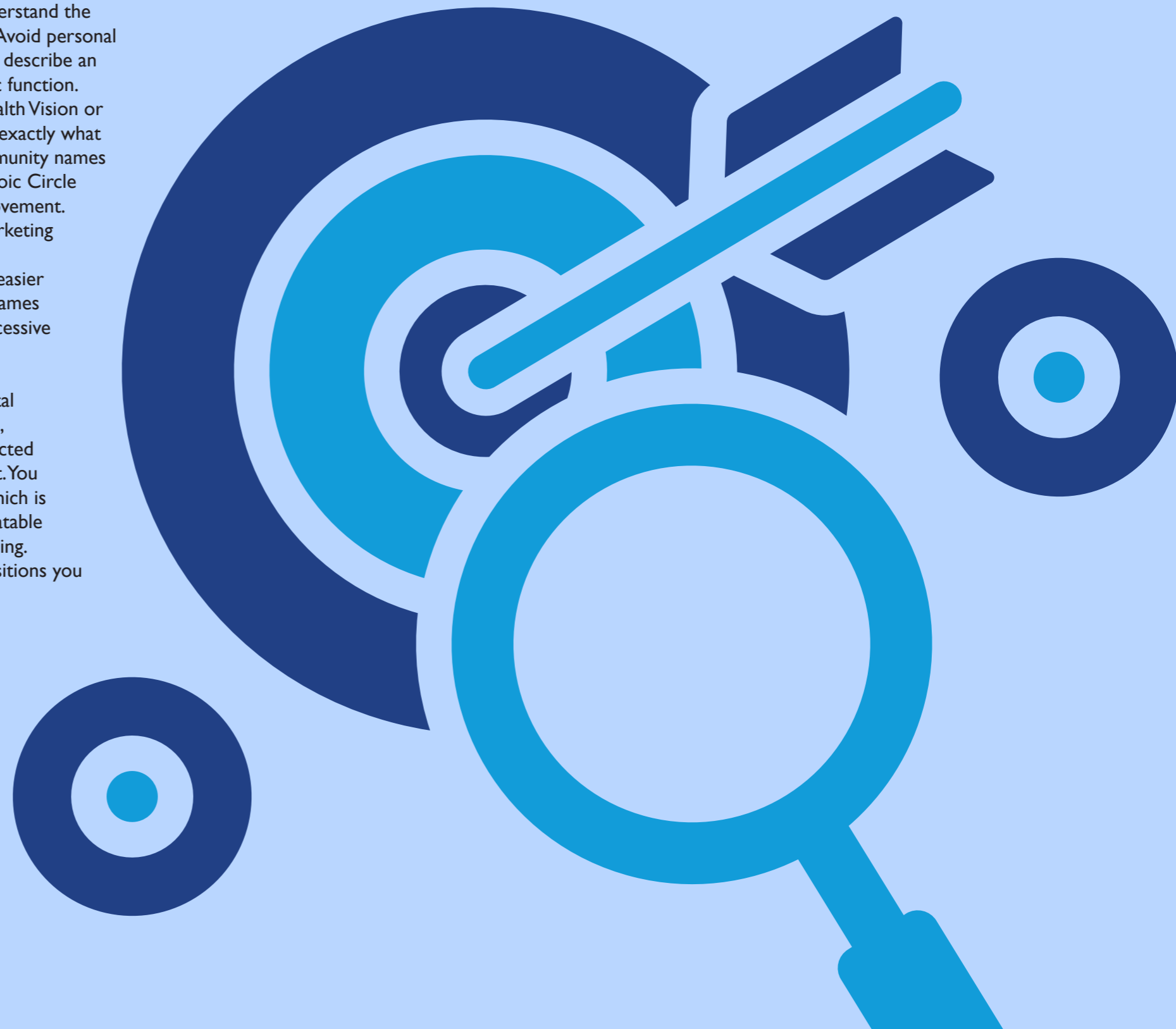

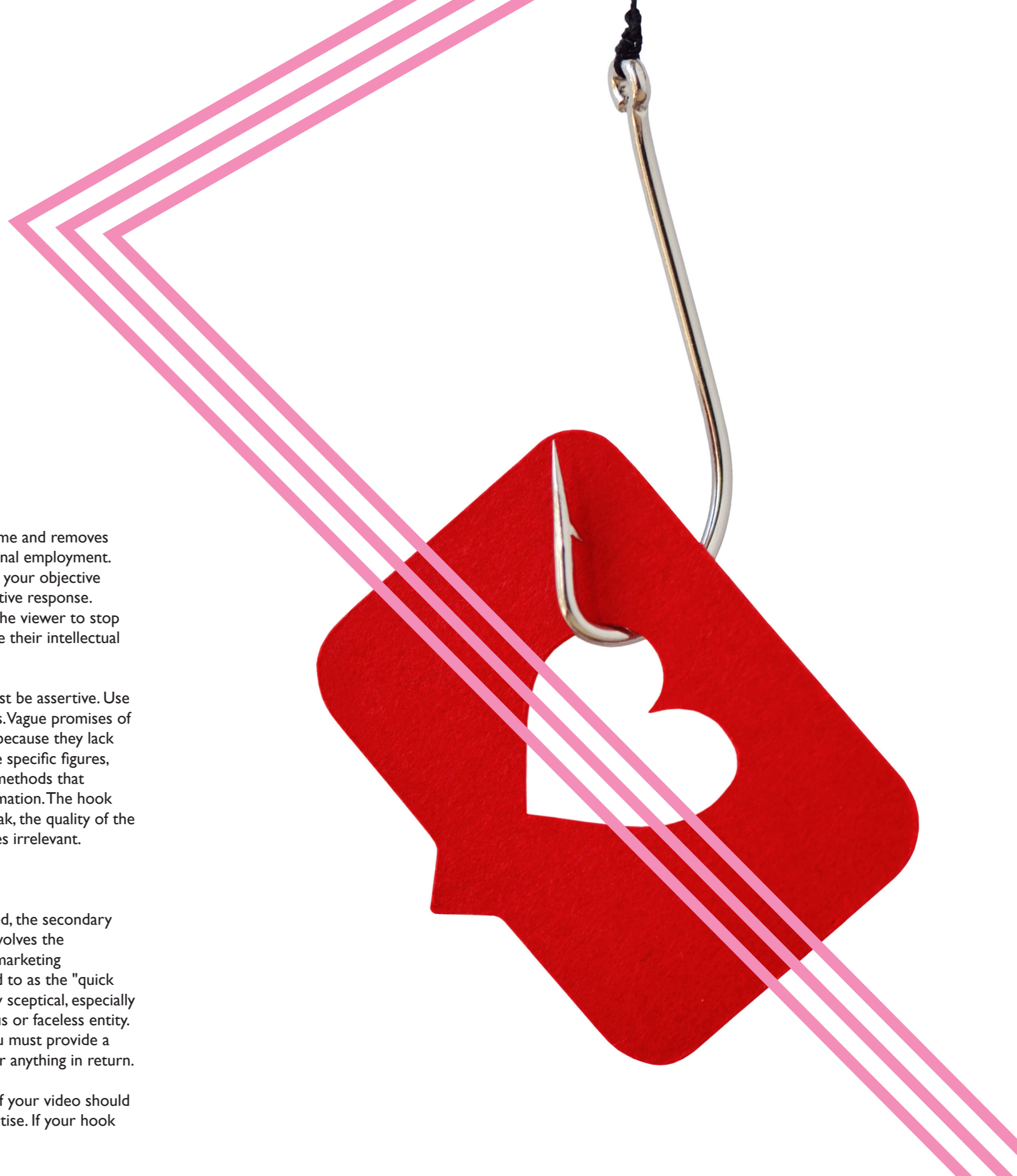

level strategy and creative direction of the brand. This systematic approach ensures that the account remains active and the engagement remains steady, even during periods when the creator is offline.

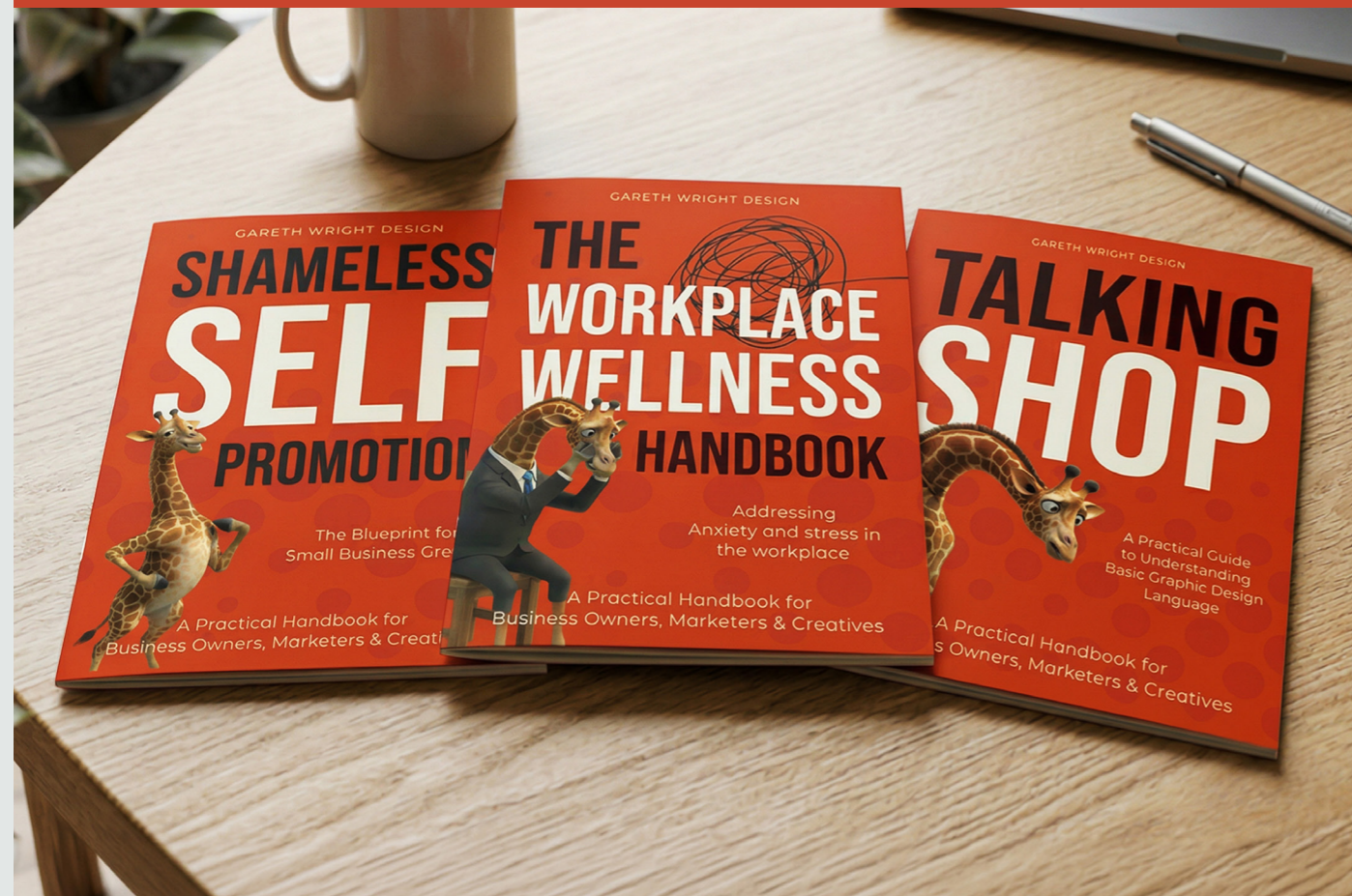
Data-Driven Optimisation
